Sharon Lewis is originally from West Virginia and her dance training began there at the age of four. She graduated from Radford University and holds a B.F.A. in Dance Performance with a concentration in Contemporary, and a B.A. in Spanish. She also has her Masters in Business Administration from American Public University. In 2008, she performed at the American College Dance Festival and, in 2011, she returned to perform a solo when her own choreography was chosen to represent her school. In 2009, she was cast as the lead in the Radford University's Theatre Department's Children's Show, "Liza and the Riddling Cave". Her senior year honors academy project included producing a show with another student, where she choreographed five pieces of abstract movement that were performed at the concert, "Novel Ideas". She is continuing to develop her own choreography on independent projects. She was also featured as an improvisational dancer in the Radford University's Percussion Ensemble's concert. As a member of Opus I Contemporary Dance she has performed at Drexel University, the Performance Garage, Koresh's "Come Together Festival", and various other festivals to promote community, autism awareness, and dance appreciation. She returned to West Virginia to choreograph a piece for the Jefferson High School Dance Ensemble to perform at "Arts Alive". Sharon co-founded Shift Movement Collective and has performed with them in West Virginia, the Lehigh Valley, and New York City.
